## UAE: World's Third Largest Re-export Hub

H.R.: The UAE, like other major oil producing countries, is currently enjoying huge revenues.

What is your government's policy with regard to windfall revenues, and what are the long term objectives of your economic policy?

diversification policy for the UAE economy away from natural fuel sectors quite some time ago. Whilst the UAE still enjoys significant fossilised fuel revenues, there is no question that those revenues will diminish over time. This was recognised and accepted quite a

few years ago and all effort has been focussed towards creating a diversified economy.

Particular successes have been a significant tourism industry and a rapidly developing aluminium industry, amongst many others, including our airlines. The adoption of free market policies and regulations have led to impressive growth rates and a trend

towards sustainable and diversified development.

The UAE is the third-largest re-export hub in the world, after Singapore and
