A Milestone in the Saudi-German Relationship

H.H. King Abdullah bin Abdulaziz Al-Saud presents Saudi economic reforms in Germany

H. King Abdullah bin Abdulaziz Al-Saud, Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques and King of Saudi Arabia, visited Berlin from the 7th-9th November 2007. During this time, he met with numerous German representatives, including Germany's President H.E. Horst Köhler, H.E. Chancellor Angela Merkel, Foreign Minister H.E. Frank-Walter Steinmeier and the mayor of Berlin, Klaus Wowereit. It was the first official visit of a Saudi King to Germany since the visit of H.H. King Khaled in 1980.

H.H. King Abdullah had come to Germany at the invitation of H.E. Chancellor Angela Merkel, who

herself had visited Saudi Arabia in February 2007. During their discussions, both emphasized the excellent bilateral relations between Germany and Saudi Arabia, as well as their desire to see their cooperation strengthened in the future, particularly in the economic domain. Germany imported Saudi goods worth 1.61 billion Euros in 2006, some 77.9% of it Saudi oil. However, Germany only meets 3% of its oil needs through imports from Saudi Arabia. Other Saudi exports to Germany are mainly made up by machinery and plastics. The volume of Saudi exports to Germany has risen sharply in recent
